OASIS COLLEGE CONNECTION

Did you know that fewer than 50% of students who graduate from Metro Nashville Public Schools enroll in college? Without information on available opportunities and resources, their options are greatly limited. Oasis College Connection (OCC) is there to support these young people. In the 2022-2023 academic school year alone, we helped 2,003 students in their post-secondary education journeys.

We regularly hear from youth who have been positively impacted by OCC. One OCC alum wrote to her Mentor "If it wasn't for your help, I would not have been able to escape my terrible situation at home and get a full ride to a top university." Another student who was admitted to Vanderbilt University said "I don't think I can ever repay all of your hard work and incredible efforts to make me successful. You have made unbelievable changes in my life."







The students who benefit from OCC come from a range of circumstances: some dream of going to college but don't know how to make it a reality; others may not even have college on their radars. As Nashville's largest college access program for low-income, New American, and first generation college students, OCC helps them explore post-secondary opportunities, reduce barriers to enrollment, and make college a realistic option. Each year, OCC provides one-on-one college counseling to more than 2,000 youth.



Our OCC Mentors begin fostering a college-going identity with high school students, offering individualized support to help them explore various colleges, majors, and interests, identify their best options, navigate the postsecondary enrollment process, prepare for entrance exams, and complete college and financial aid applications. They hold workshops, college tours, and ACT test prep courses for students considering college.

Post-high school, OCC Student Success
Advocates work with students attending Nashville
State Community College at three campuses,
supporting them through their academic journeys.
At our campus Resource Centers, we offer tutoring
services, access to laptops and printers, healthy
living workshops, presentations from business and
community partners, and other wraparound
services to help students success.


children's church we usually discuss the story in more depth and follow it with a craft or activity that helps the story (and the lesson!) sink in. A nursery is available for those younger ones.
